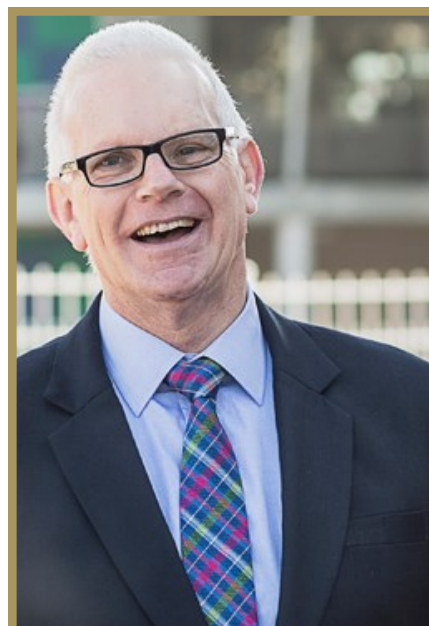

## FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL STUDENTS

### Absence

I have recently checked the absences of the students in the College. As part of the process we need to be able to have all student absences explained. The following points outline the procedures that the college will take to address absence rates of students:

- 1) During the year, if a student is absent more than five days the Leader of Learning - Pastoral will contact the family to discuss the pattern of absence. Absence will be monitored and intervention will occur if the rate of absence continues to rise.
- 2) If a student accumulates more than seven unexplained days absent, a letter will be sent requesting an interview with a parent/guardian, the College Counsellor and the Leader of Learning – Pastoral, to discuss this matter and develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.
- 3) If a student accumulates 12 unexplained days absent in a year, a second letter will be sent to the family and the Catholic Education Office Wellbeing Officer and Director of School Performance. An interview will be organised with the College Counsellor and either the Assistant Principal—Students or the Principal. The Attendance Improvement Plan will be revised and support structures put into place.
- 4) If a student has over 20 days unexplained absent a Case meeting will be organised with the Catholic Education Office to discuss the educational risk and future plans.

We understand that sickness, family commitments and other events may increase the number of absent days and this will be taken into consideration in the process. The purpose of this is to ensure that students are in the classroom as much as possible to take care of their learning needs.

The accumulation of absent days has the potential to have a big effect on the learning of a child.

The more a child is in the classroom the more chance they have at success at school. The College will work with families to ensure that every child has the best chance for success at school.

Over the next few weeks families may be contacted by the College to discuss the attendance of their children at the College. This is a process to work with families whose students have accumulated a number of absences.

If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me during school hours.

### Uniforms

The new bags have started to arrive for the Junior Campus. The bags are larger and more suitable for carrying i-pads and heavy books. All students should now be using the correct bag with the only exception being some of the Year 10 students who have been given the special privilege of using the senior bag.

The St Andrews uniform is a smart looking uniform and should be worn appropriately at all times. With the cold temperature at the moment many students are looking for ways to keep warm. Wearing thermal under garments, singlets etc. under the uniform is the best way to keep warm.

A student should not be wearing hoodies or other non-school jumpers and jackets on top of their uniform. Scarves either black or navy may be worn around the neck to help students keep warm.

# WHAT IS SCHOOLBAG

## What is Skoolbag?

Our skoolbag app provides St Andrews College with an easy way to tell parents/carers that notes are coming home, to provide access to the school calendar and to send reminders of upcoming events. It also allows you to complete e-Forms with Change of Details and an Absentee Form.

Skoolbag is a school Mobile App that communicates directly with iPhones, iPads, Android devices and Windows 8.1 devices.

If you have any feedback on the Skoolbag App please feel free to send an email via the app.

## How do you install our skoolbag app on an iPhone or iPad?

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type St Andrews College Marayong
3. If you have an iPhone, you will see our app appear, click "Free" then "install".
4. If you have an iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", our app will then be visible, click "Free" then "install"
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

## How do you install our skoolbag app on an Android device?

1. You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.
2. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device

3. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in St Andrews College, Marayong
4. Click our school name when it appears in the search.
5. Click the "Install" button.
6. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
7. Click "Open" when installed.
8. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
9. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

## How do you install our skoolbag app on a Windows 8.1 device?

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 8.1 Windows Phone or Device
2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
3. Install the Skoolbag app
4. Find your school either by using the keyboard search or location service
5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen
6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch

## CATHOLIC SCHOOLS DEBATING

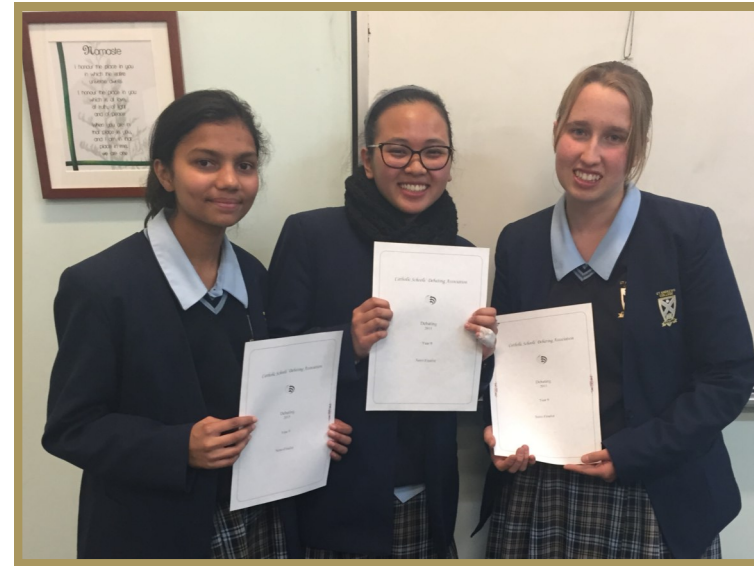

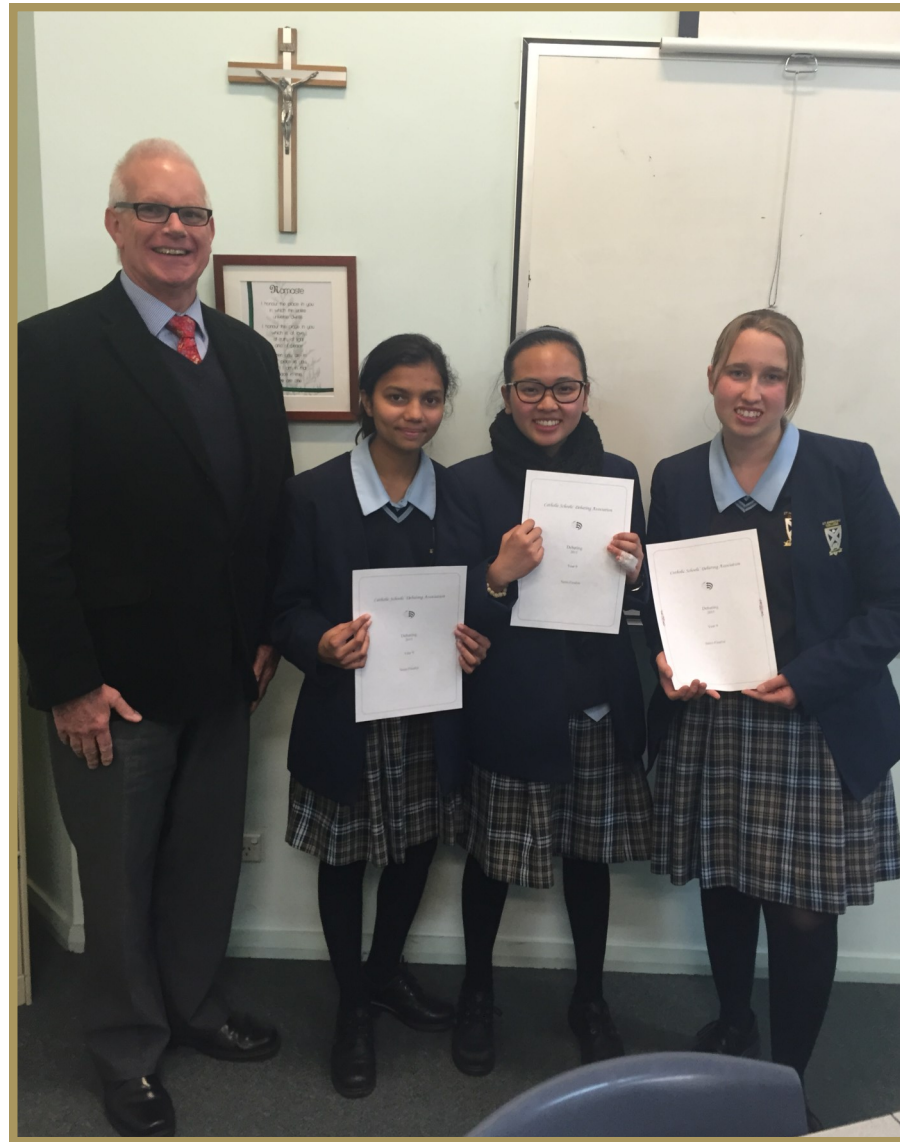
I would like to especially mention Mr Travis Kolek who not only coached the senior teams but also adjudicated debates and drove students in the school bus to all the venues around Sydney each week.

## YEAR 9 JAPANESE COOKING LESSON

On Monday 22nd of June, Year 9 Japanese class had a cultural lesson with our teacher Miss Mizukami and also with the help from Mr Kau. In this lesson we learned how to make an easy Japanese meal.

Firstly, we watched a video showing how to make "*Onigiri*". *Onigiri* is a Japanese styled sandwich made with cooked rice (*gohan*), salt and *nori* (edible seaweed paper). Miss Mizukami prepared tuna and mayonnaise to put inside the *Onigiri*. She also let us try some Japanese side dishes called *umeboshi* (Japanese salted plums) and *tukemono* (Japanese pickles). We also had miso soup that contained *tofu* and *wakame* (seaweed).

To make the lesson more exciting Miss Mizukami organised an Onigiri Beauty Contest to see which student could make the cutest *Onigiri*. We all had a great time and made very cute *onigiri*, which tasted so yummy.

Overall, it was a great learning experience and I can't wait until our next cultural lesson.

## YEAR 12 GEOGRAPHY SOUTH COAST FIELDWORK



On the 1st and 2nd of June Year 12 Geography students boarded the bus for a two day fieldtrip. The first part of our journey focussed on the spatial patterns of urban dynamics. The group viewed market gardens at Marsden Park; large mansions complete with two tennis courts, circular driveways, landscaped pools, lakes and gardens near Annangrove; the global arc of Sydney at Macquarie Park, the secondary business districts of Chatswood and North Sydney; the culture of places at Kings Cross; examples of urban renewal at Woolloomooloo; urban consolidation at Bondi and finally the older industrial suburbs to the south.

After lunch we travelled to the south coast via Stanwell Tops. By late afternoon the group arrived at Shellharbour to observe the changes to this sleepy coastal town as a result of suburbanisation. There is now a sprawling array of suburbs that have displaced many dairy farms and changed the rural landscape forever. A visit to the very active Kiama blowhole in the late afternoon sunshine left everyone in awe of nature. An overnight stay in Kiama and an excellent Mexican feast followed.

Early the next morning a few members of the group undertook a brisk walk along the shoreline. All joined in for a delicious breakfast at the Amaki Cottage Café. The cold weather ensured that most of the group ordered the 'big breakfast'! After attempting, in gale force winds, to

complete a line sketch of the hill overlooking Gerringong we arrived at Crooked River Wines. There was much to learn about the operation of the vineyard and the challenges of producing high quality grapes when the weather is so variable. In January 2013 a heat wave resulted in a day that recorded 47.5°C. Many of the grapes looked like sultanas and 100% of the crop was lost. Although there were some serious setbacks the harvests for 2014 and 2015 were 100% successful and produced quality grapes that are carefully being transformed into beautiful wines. The new manager, Godwin Felice presented a fascinating insight into the challenges confronting this local enterprise with significant impacts from the major upgrade of the Princes Highway. We learned about the high level of technical expertise required as well as the application of the most recent technology. We returned to Sydney having enjoyed a fantastic time away and gaining great insight into the economic activity of wine production. We thank Mr Johnson for driving the bus and Ms Smith for sharing her knowledge of this economic activity.
