# **Swimming Carnival**

The College swimming carnival is on Thursday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of March this year. This is a whole College event and is compulsory for every student to attend this event. Student will attend the College for Learning Groups and will travel by bus to Blacktown Aquatic Centre for the day. They will return to the College by 3pm.

# **Opening College Mass**

On Wednesday the 15<sup>th</sup> of February the Opening College Mass will be celebrated on the Junior Campus. This celebration will be shared with the Sisters of Nazareth, the founders of Holy Family school 50 years ago. Students from the Senior Campus will meet on the Junior Campus and return by bus to the Senior Campus after Mass. This is

a whole College event and is compulsory for all staff and students. The College office will be closed during this time.

#### **Attendance**

All schools in the Diocese have been set an attendance target of **94%.** This will mean that during a school year all students are expected to attend the College for 180 days out of 200 days. It is expected that there will be times that some students will be sick and cannot attend school. An acceptable absence rate for a term will be around 3 days.

Parents will be contacted by their child's Learning Advisor if the absent days go above this target rate.

There is a lot of potential damage to a student's learning and progress the more time they take off from school. It is important that each student is at school as much as possible to take advantage of every learning opportunity.

A reminder to families, if your child is late or absent they must produce a note written by the parent/guardian and signed by the parent/guardian. You have seven days to produce the note or the absence or lateness will be recorded as an unexplained. If the reply is by SMS please enter the child's name, the reason for absence (keep it short, e.g. sick) and the date of absence.

If you have a planned absence a written application must be lodged with the Principal before you are absent from school. With a change of legislation, there is more paper work that must be completed for absence. Families are discouraged from having family holidays

during term time, however we are aware that there may be a few exceptions.

If there is a problem with attendance, the College will make contact with each family to develop an attendance plan to ensure classes are not being missed.



#### Lateness

As with absence, lateness to school has the potential to cause significant harm to the students learning. Parents are asked to ensure their child is at school on time every day. There will be times that are unavoidable but if a pattern of lateness is evident the families will be asked to attend a lateness meeting to address the problem.

#### Uniform

Just a reminder about the College uniform. St Andrews College has high expectations about the way each student wears the uniform. It is expected that each student is dressed according to the College Uniform Policy (which is in the student's planner).

The College uniform expectations were developed by the College community and represent what the parents, students and College expect to see a St Andrews College student looking like. I ask all families to work with their Learning Advisors and Leaders of Learning Pastoral as they keep the standards set for the College Uniform.

Each male student is expected to be clean shaven each day. If facial hair is noticeable, they will be asked to remove it.

No male students are to have earrings of any type including clear plastic ones. Females are allowed to have one set of earrings in their lobes that are simple gold or silver sleepers or studs with a small jewel in them. All other earrings will be asked to be removed. No nose rings, tongue rings or any other piercings are acceptable.

Hair should be one natural colour and neat and tidy. Girls are to have their hair tied back at school. Boys are to have short hair according to the College policy. If a student's hair is not acceptable, families will be contacted to have it rectified.

## Communication

The first way to communicate with the College is through the Student Planner. Teachers will use the Planner to communicate small

concerns or praises. If you have any concerns you can contact the students Learning Advisor who oversees a small group of students during the year or the class teacher of different subjects. If the matter is a major concern you can ring the College to speak to your child's Leader of Learning - Pastoral or Leader of Learning - KLA. Please feel free to contact your child's teacher if you have any concerns with your child's progress in class.

The College will start using the Skoolbag App this year for many of its notes and notifications. The App is free to download from the App store on either Apple or other devices. Search for "St Andrews College Marayong skoolbag" and install the app. If families do not have access to skoolbag they will be asked to notify the College early in the term.

## Using the College car park

Parents are reminded that they are not to be using the College car park to drop or pick up students off unless they have permission from the College. There have been a number of times where students with disability have not been able to park because other parents are parking in their assigned spots. Please drop students off on Quakers Road or Benalla Crescent.

If you have any concerns please do not hesitate to contact the College. I am looking forward to another wonderful year for the College and working with the great St Andrews College community.

**Year 11 Information Night – 6<sup>th</sup> February.** Thank you to all the families who braved the heat and joined us for the Information Night. The Year 11 Assessment Booklet was handed out to students on the night and some valuable information was given regarding senior school, assessments, ICT, attendance and well being of students. Students should see Mr Bowd to collect their information booklets if they were unable to attend.

Year 7-10 Assessment booklets will be finalised in the next couple of weeks. All Assessments Booklets will be placed on DrewsLearning.

**Subject Changes:** Any requests for subject changes are to be finalised by week 4. Students must have approval from their parents for subject requests and signed off by the teachers affected by the changes. If a change is approved, students are expected to catch up on any missed work.

**NUMERACY GOAL**: The College sets a Numeracy goal each year. This year our goal is centred on student growth in Mathematics with a particular focus on Year 8 students. We will be building our understanding of mathematics and using problem solving skills to solve challenging tasks. Ask your children what they are doing in Maths and get them to teach you! Numeracy skills can be developed further at home through games and involving your child in everyday activities such as estimating the shopping, calculating speed or time when travelling, working out timetables for transport or predicting the outcome of an event.

### Hack in a box

In November last year, St Andrews College participated in an exciting new initiative by Inventium, called 'Hack In A Box'. 
Hack In A Box was an incredible experience for our students they were engaged, had fun, were creative, inventive, collaborative and basically had a ball.

# 2016 HSC STUDENTS ACHIEVE GRAEAT RESULTS



The first Senior Campus Assembly held on Friday the 10<sup>th</sup> of February celebrated the outstanding 2016 HSC results.

Ten St Andrews College students achieved an ATAR of over 90. Our ATAR Dux Khang Nguyen achieved an ATAR of 99.40, ATAR 2<sup>nd</sup> Place Marc Isakov achieved an ATAR 98.35, ATAR 3<sup>rd</sup> Place Katrina Quizon achieved an ATAR of 97.15. # **COMMUNITY NOTICEBOARD**

Dear friends,

Re: Royal Commission Case Study 50 - Catholic Church Authorities

The final hearing involving the Catholic Church at the Royal Commission into institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse commences on 6 February 2017.

For the victims and survivors, for the Catholic community and for many in the wider Australian community, this hearing may be a difficult and even distressing time, as the Royal Commission reviews the evidence it has already received and seeks to understand why and how these tragedies occurred.

Deeply mindful of the hurt and pain caused by abuse, I once again offer my sincerest applogy on behalf of the Catholic Church and the Diocese of Parramatta. I am deeply sorry for the damage that has been done to the lives of victims of sexual abuse and their loved ones. As Pope Francis said recently. It is a sin that shames us.

Over the next three weeks, evidence presented during the Royal Commission hearings will be analysed, statistics about the extent of abuse will be made public, and the way forward will be explored. Many of our bishops - including myself - and other Catholic leaders will appear before the Royal Commission. They will explain what the Church has been doing to change the old culture that allowed abuse to continue and to put in place new policies, structures and protections to safeguard children and sumerable adults.

Pope Prancis has urged the whole Church to, 'find the courage needed to take all necessary measures and to protect in every way the lives of our children, so that such crimes may never be repeated'.

Our Diocese will continue working openly and transparently with the Royal Commission and other authorities in order to ensure our child protection policies and procedures are strengthened.



TO THE FAMILIES WHO HAVE CHILDREN THEY WISH TO BE PREPARED FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF PENANCE (RECONCILIATION). FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION IN 2017

In 2011, the Diocese of Parramatta released a revised Sacraments of Initiation Policy for children preparing for the above mentioned sacraments. The process of preparation for these sacraments remains as a parish based, family centred program which creates particular opportunities for parents to continue sharing their faith with their child at the appropriate time. The sequence for the reception of these sacraments has returned to the order that you may remember as a child.

The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. The Sacrament of Penance, sometimes called Reconciliation or Confession, is also an important part of the journey of faith for all of us. It is necessary to receive this Sacrament before you are able to receive the Sacrament of First Holy Communion.

As with all Sacramental Programs it is essential that parents and children are involved. While the students are supported by religious studies in the schools, the actual preparation takes place on a parish and home level. Parents and children are required to attend Sunday Mass and classes, and parents are helped by facilitators who conduct

Each year there are opportunities for your children to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. This is based on the presumption that they have already received the Sacrament of Baptism, as this is the pre-requisite for all other Sacraments. Usually the Sacrament of Penance is received in Year Two. First Holy Communion may be received the year after the Sacrament of Penance is received. Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation may begin when your child has entered Year 5 or Year 6 and have already made their First Holy Communion.

Parents have an essential role in discerning when their children are ready to be prepared for the Sacraments. When they believe this is the case they should present the children for registration in the appropriate Sacramental Program.

There is a definite commitment required of families involved in Sacramental Programs. Parents will have to attend one or two Parent Education Evenings in regard to the Sacraments concerned. There will also be an Enrolment Ceremony conducted during Mass on a Sunday morning. Attendance at the 8:45am Sunday masses and all classes during the Sacramental Preparation Program are compulsory.

#### Please Note: What does 'Parish-Based Preparation Programs' mean?

What this means in practice is that families need to present their children to their own parish community for preparation.

In other words for people to be eligible to receive the sacrament in St. Andrew's Parish, Marayong, they need to fulfil one of the following criteria -

- > The family must live within the parish boundaries of the Parish and / or
- The families need to have chosen this parish as their parish community and this is expressed by .
  - o their registering as parishioners of this Parish and
  - by their participation in the life of this parish community.

If you do not live within the parish boundaries of St Andrew's, or are not registered as a parishioner of the parish, you will need to explain why you are seeking the Sacraments here at St Andrew's. This should be done before the Registration Night. It will require an appointment with one of the Priests or the Sacramental Coordinator. Attendance at the schools in the parish does not automatically make one a parishioner of this parish. As all Sacramental Programs are parish based, it is normally the case that Sacraments are received in the parish where you live or the parish where you worship and are involved.

If your child was baptised at a Church other than St Andrew's Marayong, you will need to bring along the child's original Baptismal Certificate.

#### What should you do now?

The Program for 2017 is outlined below. Please note in your diaries the Registration Period for each Sacramental Preparation Program you wish to enroll your child for and register in person at the Parish Office during that period. [Only PARENTS can collect a Registration form for their child / children.]
